NAFCA met on Thursday, September 14 at 11:00. Chief Bailey and Madison hosted NAFCA at Madison Fire Station 1, 101 Mill Road, Madison AL 35758. We had a report from the Nominations Committee. We were fortunate to have Det. Stacy Thomas with Madison PD offering a presentation on the Mental Health issues in our communities and some of their actions to combat this. I think we all realize that Mental Health is an issue statewide, and as that system is having problems many of those with mental health symptoms may not be getting proper treatment. That in turns leaves first responders to answer more mental health calls.

October NAFCA meeting agenda. AT&T's Michele Pilgreen reached out to give an update on FirstNet and all that the system offers. Last meeting, it was reported that the Nomination Committee nominated the following for 2018 Officers: President- Chief Tony Grande, 1st VP- Chief Wade Buckner, 2nd VP- Deputy Chief Brandy Williams, S/T- Chief Brad Hix. The election was held with no nominations from the floor and all nominees unanimously voted in to service. Adrean Booth, Alabama Fire College, offered information on the AFC Continuing Education program and encouraged members to utilize the FC as a resource.

NAFCA's November meeting did not meet quorum as it was held at Chief Buckner's Retirement Ceremony at 5 pm in the Apparatus Bay of Jacksonville Fire Dept. Station 1 at 911 Public Safety Drive, Jacksonville AL 36250. NAFCA had several members in attendance with President G. Necklaus presenting our thanks for Chief Buckner's service to NAFCA and to Jacksonville.

NAFCA's December meeting was held at the Huntsville Fire Department's J.O. Johnson Training Academy. Discussion was held in reference to the ADPH reporting requirements for those departments providing ALS services to citizens. Many Records Management Systems (RMS) are unable to meet the reporting requirements. FireHouse™ RMS is one system that will not currently meet the state reporting requirement. Additionally, FH™ has sold to ESO and ESO will assist with meeting the requirement. Discussion on the various solutions to this issue. AFC Region 2 Coordinator spoke on the Smoke Alarm program and the paperwork associated with placement of smoke alarms. Discussion was had on the various issues with legal departments and their requirements for documentation in addition to the AFC paperwork. Members were mulling over seeking a legislative solution to indemnify fire departments that wish to install smoke detectors for the general welfare and benefit of the residents of the state. A motion to support the following bill as the Alabama Joint Fire Council was made and successfully passed by the body (HB1/SB2, HB7/SB4, HB28/SB6, HB41, HJR53/SJR18, General Fund Budget and Education Trust Fund Budget.

The 2018 Memorial Service was set for October 6, 2018 at 1500. John Merrill will be the speaker.

### Alabama Joint Fire Council

Minutes of the 7 September 2017 Meeting

The AJFC met on Thursday, 7 September 2017 at the Rocky Ridge Fire Station.

Vice-Chairman Pilgreen called the meeting to order.

All members were given a copy of the previous meeting's minutes prior to the start of the meeting. A motion to approve the minutes as amended was made by S. Kittrell and seconded by X. Glover. The motion carried unanimously.

All members were given a copy of the current financial statement prior to the start of the meeting. A motion to approve the report as read was made by B. Doss and seconded by S. Kittrell. The motion carried unanimously.

### **Member Agency Reports**

- **AAVFD** B. Doss stated that the AAVFD conference turned out well and all the board officers remained the same.
- AFA R. Vaughan stated that AFA was working with another group regarding their 2018 summer conference. Vaughan also reported that he was representing AFA and NVFC on the NFPA3000 Committee.
- **AAFC** D. West reported that the summer conference was the most successful conference. West reported that Steve Carroll has been elected president and that the legislative committee assigned to Joint Fire Council would remain the same.
- **PFFA** S. Kittrell reported that David Harer was the new president and he would be taking a seat on the AJFC. Kittrell reported that the remainder of the committee would be Allen Marks and himself.
- **AFMO** S. Pilgreen reported that there were 60 fire fatalities so far this year. Pilgreen stated that the number currently is close to where we were last year. Pilgreen spoke about the sprinkler bill and the development of curriculum with Mary Beth from the Alabama Fire College.

AFC – R. Vaughan stated that AFC had put the Continuing Education program out on the streets in order to assist departments in keeping their training focused and meeting the standard required by ISO and other groups. Vaughan reported that that Administrative Code streamlining would be dealt with at the next meeting. Vaughan stressed that nothing was being eliminated from the code, but that the existing language would be cleaned up. Vaughan also reported that the new physical requirement for volunteer firefighters entering the 160 course would most likely be going into effect January 1, 2018.

**Forestry** – G. Wood stated that the State Forester sent his regrets for not being able to be there. Wood stated that the Asst. State Forester had just retired, and the search would be underway for a replacement. Wood reported that there was a proposal to reduce the number of Regions from six to four in order to lower the overhead costs. The Forestry Commission has been asked to approve this at their next meeting.

Memorial – R. Vaughan reported that assignments had been made for the memorial and the only significant change is that Scott Pilgreen will be the speaker. Vaughan asked for volunteers to assist with the families and D. West volunteered to take the lead on this. Vaughan reminded everyone that it would be in the auditorium and we would kick off at 1500.

R. Vaughan reported that a cancer registry resolution was being drawn up to go before the house and the senate. Vaughan reported that wording was being put in place for a Joint Resolution to be passed stating that the Alabama Fire College would be the state's POC for the CDC to work with.

On behalf of the Legislative Committee, please accept the following report for consideration:

Several legislative matters of interest to the body have been introduced for the upcoming Alabama legislative session.

- HB1/SB2- A reintroduction of the Deferred Retirement Option Plan (DROP) for ERS and TRS
  employees. This legislation is a modification of the previous DROP, in an effort to make the
  action cost-neutral to the Retirement System. The proposed legislation offers a reduced (relative
  to the previous DROP) benefit to retain experienced employees. The legislation keeps the age and
  service requirements of the previous DROP. The committee endorses HB1/SB2 as pre-filed.
- HB7/SB4- Diesel Exhaust Systems. This legislation was first introduced 2 sessions prior and
  effectively contested by various groups. Members of the AAFC Legislative Committee have
  worked with Representative Hanes during previous sessions to amend and adapt the language to
  achieve the intent of the bill (reducing carcinogenic exposure) in an effective and efficient
  fashion. The committee supports HB7/SB4 as pre-filed.
- HB41- Retiree Cancer Bill. This bill would provide retired firefighters with benefits in the event
  that an occupational disease is diagnosed within 10 years of retirement. This would extend some
  benefit similar to the 'Heart & Lung' bill to retirees. As of this report, the committee is working
  with Rep. Hanes to expand the definition of cancer in the bill, expected to be amended as such
  once assigned to a House committee. The committee supports HB41 provided an expanded
  definition of cancer.

Additionally, there are a few expected legislative matters that have not been filed as of this report:

- Revisions to ADPH EMS license requirements. The committee defers to the SEMCC for further details on the proposed changes.
- Legislation to change the Tier II RSA (non-state) employees to a Tier I benefit, including 'Stress Time' for fire, law enforcement, and corrections officers- Discussions continue on the details of this proposed legislation. Committee members are coordinating with Rep. Hanes, House Maj. Leader Rep. Ledbetter, RSA staff, and the leadership of the PFFA to finalize acceptable language that meets the intent. The committee recognizes the benefit this could have in terms of recruitment and retention of quality employees.
- A Joint Resolution establishing a Firefighter Cancer Registry in the state, to be used for the data collection and evaluation of firefighter cancers. The committee supports this effort.

The committee has attended calls and meetings of the Joint Fire Council in an effort to keep apprised of potential legislative matters impacting the membership. Further, Legislative Committee member Chief Donnie West also serves as a voting member of the Joint Fire Council for the AAFC, ensuring continuity between the groups.

Chief Carroll:

SEMCC continues to move forward in the endeavor to add medications and treatments for prehospital providers. Our last SEMCC meeting was December 12, 2017 in Clanton. Action was taken on many protocol revisions and several new medications were approved by the committee. Currently, SEMCC actions are being heard by the State Board of Health in February 2018 and upon approval we expect the new protocols to come out after March 2018. SEMCC will meet again on March 6<sup>th</sup> at the Fire College. The new medications and changes are summarized as follows:

- Added two new required medications: Cardizem and Ketamine
- Added five new optional medications: Epi auto-injectors for basics, Labetalol, Racemic Epi, TXA and Heprin.
- Added IM as an acceptable route of administration to the Narcan protocol.
- Spineboards may only be utilized for transport if the patient is paralyzed.
- Deleted Valium from protocols.
- Bougie was approved for Ped use.
- Many pediatric medications were moved from Cat B to Cat A.
- Ketamine will not only replace Haldol, but was also approved as a pain management medication that can be given instead of morphine or fentynal.
- The EMISIS version 3 mandate took effect January 1, 2018

• ADPH/OEMS has proposed a piece of draft legislation (attached to this report). It proposes to remove specific licensure fees and designate that fees be handled under Section 41-1-11 of the State Code as ratified in 2016. Further increases will be limited to the annual CPI under this statute. Additionally, it will require FBI fingerprint background checks for initial EMT licensure. The cost was verified at \$39.95 through the State. Finally. It struck Apparatus Operator as an approved course for driver. After discussion and a meeting with Joint Fire Council, AO will remain in the draft legislation as an approved course certification. With this allowance in place, everyone has shown support for the legislation.

The next meeting of SEMCC will be at the Fire College on March 6, 2018.

Steve,

I am writing to report on the activity of the Alabama Fire College and Personnel Standards Commission since my update at the annual conference in August. The Commission met for the scheduled quarterly meeting on October 18, 2017. During this meeting, we approved the adoption of several changes to the administrative code for Fire Fighter certification. Most of these changes were clerical in nature, but we did approve the requirement of a physical statement as a prerequisite for beginning the Certified Volunteer Fire Fighter course. We also repealed the Fire Fighter I/II Bridge Certification Program in the administrative code as it is included as a method of delivery in the Certified Fire Fighter program. Again, this was merely a housekeeping issue and has no impact on the Bridge Program itself. We recognized Kim Davis as our employee of the quarter for all of her efforts in our certification processes. We were advised that Tim Love was selected as our new Section Chief of Training and would begin work on November 1st. We took action to purchase a new tractor for our recently ordered new mobile drill tower. Finally, a new certification was proposed, and we approved moving forward with consideration of it as Certified Incident Management Team Member as a means to enhance the statewide IMT process.

The Commission postponed the scheduled quarterly meeting for January 17<sup>th</sup> due to the winter weather, and the meeting was held on January 26<sup>th</sup>. During this meeting, the Commission was given an update on the National Center for Fire and Life Safety by Russell Jackson. The NCFLS is moving forward with funding and NFPA as the main sponsor. We continue to closely monitor this project as we have made financial commitments to assist with its formation. We recognized Melony Carroll as our employee of the quarter and again recognized Kim Davis as our 2017 Employee of the Year. We were presented the Chief Kenneth V. Elmore Award from ProBoard recognizing our 35 years of membership and more than 100,000 ProBoard certifications that we have issued. We are only the fourth entity to receive this award. We reviewed the new requirements of a Fire Fighter Proficiency Exam which must be successfully completed as a prerequisite to enter the Fire Fighter Bridge delivery program. We gave final approval to the proposed Certified Incident Management Team Member certification. We reviewed and approved the 2017 financial audit which came back with no significant findings. This was a great example of the hard work and diligence of the AFC staff and shows our progress as a stand-alone educational institution. We approved changes to the Notice of Employment Form and Physical




Statement in order to clarify and streamline these for use of all applicants. Finally, we toured the newly acquired and delivered mobile drill tower which was purchased with AFG funds. With the new tractor expected to be delivered soon, this will be another great asset for specialized training in the field.

It continues to be a pleasure and honor to represent the AAFC on the AFC&PSC, and I am excited about the direction and future of the Alabama Fire College. I am always open for suggestions and welcome any thoughts or concerns from our AAFC members.

Re: Report to AAFC E-Board from CABT representative

Steve,

I am writing to report on activity of the CABT – Coalition Against Bigger Trucks since our annual conference in August. This coalition was formed to resist any efforts of Congress that would allow for larger, longer, or heavier trucks on our roadways, and the AFC has stood firm as a supporting member. The coalition group in Alabama consists of representatives from public safety (AAFC, AAVFD, State Troopers Assoc., Sheriffs Assoc.) and ALDOT. During this period, the CABT has been preparing for the next round of legislative attempts by the big truck lobbyists by asking for support signatures from all of our agencies. In 2015, a weight increase to 91,000 pounds and an increase in the length of double trailers from 28' to 33' was defeated by a bipartisan group in the House and Senate, respectively. This year, a handful of large shipping companies are gearing up for a well-funded push by stepping up their lobbying efforts. We need to push back their efforts. There are a handful of imminent threats which makes this letter important. These include additional work on the appropriations bill, upcoming infrastructure bills and the push for a new, limited study on impacts of Double 33-trucks from USDOT. We are worried this study could give the big truck lobbyists an opportunity to slip these proposals through quickly and quietly if there is no pushback from local governments that have to bear the brunt of the impact. I forwarded out a letter from CABT, and several of our members responded by adding their names to share with Members of Congress. We will continue to monitor activity in Washington, and I will continue to work with this group to represent our public safety interests. Please forward any questions or concerns that you or the AAFC members might have regarding this issue.

### Goals

- Our goals remain the same in that we wish to increase membership in the fund as well as secure one or more substantial revenue streams.
- We are working on legislation that would provide funding from fees collected by the Fire Marshals office on fireworks and pyrotechnics permits. It is estimated that this would generate between \$15,000.00 and \$20,000.00 annually for the fund.

# ALABAMA FIRST RESPONDERS WIRELESS COMMISSION REPORT

The Wireless Commission met many time through-out the year in Montgomery to review all the options the State of Alabama had with the Opt In or Opt Out decision concerning FirstNet. After many hours of working through the details, we are pleased to report that AT&T was awarded a twenty year contract. After the award, we began negotiating for the State of Alabama's best interest and made a recommendation to the Governor by the Commission.

On September 21, 2017, the Commissioners voted 100% unanimously to Opt In with FirstNet and made this recommendation to Governor Ivey. On October 10, 2017, at a fire station in Montgomery, Governor Ivey held a press conference and announced that the State of Alabama would take the recommendation of the Alabama First Responders Wireless Commission and Opt In with FirstNet and their partner AT&T.
