I am writing to report on activities of the Southeastern Association of Fire Chiefs Board of Directors since my appointment at the summer conference. The SEAFC Board meets monthly via Zoom to discuss board business, initiatives, and plans for the annual summer conferences. As you know, the 2022 conference in Mobile was a great success in both attendance and revenue and providing a great training opportunity. The SEAFC Board has acknowledged and thanks the Mobile FD, City of Mobile, and AAFC for such a great partnership that led to that success. This was invaluable training that was attended by over 300 firefighters from across the country.


CAFCA is still producing a local regional training calendar that helps to provide training at no cost to our members.

Chief Stephens,

I am writing to report on activity of the Southwestern Alabama Association of Fire Chiefs since our summer conference in June. We met in-person on July 21st at the Baldwin County 911 Center and had 16 guests representing 7 fire departments, EMS, and 911 along with several vendors. The meeting and meal were sponsored by Air Care/Medstar. We had good discussion regarding the very successful summer conference and thanked Mobile and Chief Lami for all of their efforts. We also received training updates from AFC (Jeff Ludlam) and AGEMSS (David Garmon). Next, we met on September 15th at the Baldwin County 911 Center with 30 guests in attendance representing 7 different fire departments represented along with AGEMSS and 4 vendors. This meeting and meal was sponsored by EEP. Chief Lami gave an update from the new AAFC Executive Board. Jeff Ludlam gave an update from AFC on the dashboard portal and regional training. We received an update from AGEMSS on new protocols from David Garmon. We met again on November 17th at the Baldwin County 911 Center with 12 attending, representing 6 fire departments and 3 vendors. The meeting and meal were sponsored by AFRBP with assistance from Tommy Liverett. We discussed the SEAFC EMS survey and some potential upcoming legislation impacting PTSD and bigger trucks. Lastly, we met on January 16th at the Baldwin County 911 Center with one of our best attending meetings with new vendors and several new fire departments represented. The meeting and meal were sponsored by NAFECO. We had discussion and updates on regional training, EMS, the AAFC Mutual Aid efforts, and CFSI. A motion was passed to support the AAFC efforts at the upcoming CFSI trip with a \$500 contribution. We also held our election of officers, and I was re-elected at President along with Charles Jackson as our Sec/Treasurer. Melvin Shepard from Gulf Shores was elected to serve as our





new Vice-President. All present were encouraged to attend the upcoming mid-winter conference. Re: AAFC Commissioner Report from AFC

President Stephens and AAFC Members:

This report provides details of activity with the Alabama Fire College and Personnel Standards Commission.

We held a special called commission meeting December 16th in Oxford to discuss two items. The first item was about potential legislation to be filed in January that would change the state law regarding the employment of EMT only personnel within fire departments. The commission discussed several potential issues if this passes. The consensus of the commission is they would not be in support of this. The second item was about the increase to recruit school hours. There were many other ideas discussed, many of which would not be a positive change for the fire service. We heard from several fire service professionals in the room, all of which were not supportive of the ideas that were mentioned. Several commissioners verbally stated they would not support these ideas. No decision on changes were made at this meeting. We also discussed and approved posting an RFP for a Legislative Affairs Liaison. We currently have someone filling this role but we feel there is an opportunity for change that could benefit us more.

The most recent quarterly meeting took place on October 19th. The finance committee approved the Executive Director to apply for an ambulance through the AFG process. The AFC will host its first Critical Care Paramedic class in January. There was a lot of interest in this class and we may look at hosting another one in the near future. The EMS classes continue to demonstrate success due to the hard work of AFC personnel and participating departments. The new Prop Storage Building was 51% completed at this point and is still on track to be completed the end of January 2023. The use of the department dashboard has increased and AFC personnel continue to make improvements. We continue to discuss changes to the administrative code to increase Certified Firefighter Recruit School hours from 360 to 400 and to increase the hours for the Bridge Program from 200 to 240. We asked for several data points to aid in our decision-making process. No decision or changes were made at this meeting.

The July commission meeting took place on July 20th. The finance committee approved funding to improve the audio-visual system in the Zaragoza Auditorium. We voted to extend the Executive Director's contract by one year which will now expire the second quarterly meeting

of 2024. The commission approved an RTC request from five fire departments (Homewood, Hoover, Mountain Brook, Rocky Ridge and Vestavia Hills). The approval of this request will take the burden off Birmingham and Shelby County so each department can focus on training their personnel.

Re: Summary Brief (Michael A. Bartlett, Association Representative to the Alabama State Emergency Medical Control Committee (SEMCC))

Chief Stephens:

SEMCC met on 7 November 2022. In this meeting ADPH/OEMS notified SEMCC of several rules changes that need to be made. We, SEMCC, expect to see a rules change draft forthcoming.

HJR34 passed last year creating a public sector seat on the State Trauma Funding Committee. I was appointed to that position by the Ambulance Association. We will be seeking 30 million in funding in the 2023 legislative session, with hopes of getting 20 million approved.

HB237 (Medicaid Assessment Bill) passed. Hopefully, by the end of Q1 for 2023 our reimbursement rates from Medicaid will increase to the \$600.00 range. Medicaid will be assessing providers around 4% of their revenue to fund the program through the Federal match program.

Please remember in 2023, ALS providers will have to carry a narcotic, either Fentanyl or Morphine.

The Medicare inflation factor has been released for 2023 at 8.7%. This will equate to an equal increase in reimbursements.

Please be advised we have met quarterly over the last year. The main topic of discussions are the new antenna locations for the Alabama FirstNet system then we had discussed State wide coverage for the 700, 800 system. We are continuing to work on Statewide coverage for WIFI and Two-Way radios. We have met and talked with the Chief of Staff for the Governor to fund these projects with ARPA monies. He has asked us to holdoff until the second round of monies come in to the State. We will keep you updated on this project.

Formalize Communications Unit: we have competed an SOP for this Unit

EFOG (Electronic Field Operations Guide) for Alabama is still in draft phase at this time

County TICP (Tactical Interoperability Plan) Draft Template sent to Counties

Statewide Notification System update: legislation passed, a technical committee will be created for lessons learned, standard operating protocols, etc. 20 committee members with room for three AFRWC Commissioners. I have let Jeb Hargrove know that I am interested in serving on this committee.


Here are a few things for the report:

- Total expenses for the year of 2022 the JFC spent \$15,323.72. We placed a new piece of marble at the Memorial
 in cooperation with the Alabama Fire College Foundation. The monument has been placed on the concrete
 footing that the Alabama Fire College put in place and everything matches and looks beautiful.
- The present account balance for the memorial account is \$39,786.67. Out of the PTSD account we have spent \$11,300.00 for a mental health, PTSD curriculum. Balance in the PTSD account is \$9860.65. The general checking account has \$1770.57.
- The legislative agenda for the 2023 legislative session has been discussed several bills to be pre-filed. At present the JFC is tracking legislation that will be pre-filed for this coming year.

Re: Report to AAFC E-Board from CABT representative

Chief Stephens,

I am writing to report on activity of the CABT – Coalition Against Bigger Trucks since our summer conference in June. This coalition was formed to resist any efforts of Congress that would allow for larger, longer, or heavier trucks on our roadways, and the AAFC has stood firm as a supporting member. The coalition group in Alabama consists of representatives from public safety (AAFC, AAVFD, State Troopers Assoc., Sheriffs Assoc.) and ALDOT.


In August, federal legislation was introduced in the House that would require states to allow longer "double 33" trucks and increase the federal truck weight limit from 80,000 to 97,000 pounds. These bills were seemingly introduced to address supply chain and truck driver shortage issues. The CABT has voiced strong opposition to the bills.

In September, our association was asked to once again affirm our support of CABT by listing our name with the other groups from Alabama in our state coalition. We communicated with CABT leadership that we would continue our aggressive support of their efforts.

In October, Rick Cowan, the regional rep for CABT announced his retirement, and Liz Bolstad was named our CABT contact. We look forward to working with Liz in our upcoming efforts.

We believe that our upcoming legislative session in Alabama will once again produce a bill to increase weight limits on logging trucks in the state, so we will closely monitor those efforts. With our success in fighting efforts for bigger trucks at the federal level, we believe that there will be many more attempts at the state level. With the new Congress, we will also need to be prepared to continue to voice our concerns in Washington, especially during our CFSI visits.





We will continue to monitor activity in Washington and Montgomery, and I will continue to work with this group to represent our public safety interests. Please forward any questions or concerns that you or the AAFC members might have regarding this issue.
